The Word of the Laird



Today's Gospel reflects on the situation of the early church in and around Jerusalem. Those who came to believe in Jesus as the Christ were not the wealthy, but those who were looking for something deeper. Contemporary Judaism valued being "healthy, wealthy and wise." So for Jesus to emphasize that being wealthy was an obstacle to entering the kingdom of God, He was at variance with the accepted wisdom of the times.

It is to be noted that after the young man admits to keeping the commandments, Jesus "looked at him with love." We find a similarity to this in the gospel of John where Jesus regards John as the "beloved disciple."

Then Jesus challenges the young man urging him to sell what he has, give to the poor, building up treasure in heaven and then coming to follow Him. The young man turns away because he has great possessions.

The message that Jesus then draws is that wealth is an obstacle to truly sharing in God's kingdom. Understanding ourselves as poor and in need of God's generous love is essential for entering that kingdom.



A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FOR-MATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

This weekend we celebrate the **28**th **Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Our readings guide us to God's wisdom and encourage us to rely on our own as well – wisdom we receive in many ways through scripture, prayer and guidance from the Holy Spirit. It is through wisdom that salvation is achieved.

Our first reading from the Book of Wisdom imparts that wisdom is worth more than riches and brings contentment and understanding to our lives. "I prayed, and prudence was given

me; I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me... Beyond health and comeliness I loved her, and I chose to have her rather than the light... all good things together came to me in her company, and countless riches at her hands." Wisdom affords us the riches of living a life with true understanding and knowledge given to us by God.

Our second reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Hebrews reiterates this message as Paul shares that "the word of God is living and effective... and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart." Discerning "reflections and thoughts of the heart" is something every Christian should endeavor to do. Why? Because God resides in our heart. God's word, as St. Paul tells us, is "living and effective" reflecting on the word is so important because the message it shares is one of hope, love and mercy. Taking the time – no – MAKING the time to read scripture, pray and simply spend time alone with God is vital to the life of a Christian.

The gospel passage from St. Mark shares that it's essential that we rely on God, experience God, and live for God in all we do. In this passage a man asks Jesus, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" and Jesus informs him to live the commandments. While the man says he strives to live this way, Jesus urges him there is more to do. "Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." Unfortunately, that's not the answer the man was hoping for and "he went away sad, for he had many possessions." This is an extreme example, but there are people that give up worldly materials and live lives of prayer and service. The monks at the Abbey of the Genesee are a good example of this. They willingly give their lives over to God. They live in a modest and humble way of service and prayer. They live in community and support and care for one another. We all do this to a certain extent. We live for our families and friends. We go to work. We go to church. We take care of our children, and as we grow older our children become caregivers of us. We put the needs of others in front of our own. We live as disciples of Jesus. Do we do it perfectly? No – but we try. And we know it's worth it. We rely on the wisdom of those that have come before us, and most especially on the wisdom of God. And the readings this week are a good reminder for us to seek out that wisdom. We don't have to do this on our own. We are not alone. God's wisdom surrounds us. God is there. God is always there.
