

A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

This weekend we celebrate the **25th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. The readings both challenge and encourage us to live a life of faithful service—even amongst the obstacles that stand in our way.

Our first reading from the Book of Wisdom coveys a message that most Christians have heard at one time or another (I know I have). "People that 'claim' to be Christian are just hypocrites. They say one thing but do another." Our reading says the same in this way. "Let us beset the just one, because he is obnoxious to us; ... Let us condemn him to a shameful death; for according to his own words, God will take care of him."

The second reading from the Letter of St. James reminds us that "Where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice ...But the wisdom from above is first of all pure, then peaceable, gentle, compliant, full of mercy and good fruits, without inconstancy or insincerity. And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace for those who cultivate peace." That's what we are

called to do – CULTIVATE peace in ALL we do. We work for it, and we live it. Even in the confines of our Christian service, peace is not always a priority. Rather, many of us, as disciples seek to be praised and held up on a pedestal for our service. Our gospel passage from St. Mark addresses how we must live in discipleship for what it truly is – following Jesus. Living as Jesus. Being Jesus to others – AND doing that with humility.

I cannot tell you how often through the years (and I will soon be entering into my 25th year of ministry) I've been asked, "How many kids are... receiving first communion ... being confirmed ...in youth group?" In ministry, we are here to teach, guide and love. It's not about "how many." Every wonderful committee we have in our churches believes their group is the most vital to the parish. Which is a good thing, but we must remember that it's not the number of kids or the number of hours you put into your serving that matters, it's about relying on the Holy Spirit to direct both our actions and our thoughts. Remember, Jesus began with only 12 disciples and look where we are now!

Everyone that serves is important, and everyone that serves is crucial. But HOW we serve is just as important. We serve to share the love of God with others. That's it. Really. No more, no less. And we need to remember that it's not about how good we are, but instead it's about the effort. The person who prays the rosary daily for special intentions is just as important as the Pope. Yep, I said it. Now, don't get me wrong—I love our Holy Father, Pope Francis, but in God's eyes we are all equal. We are all baptized as priest, prophet and king. That means we all set apart for special work, yet that call comes with responsibility. We follow, we lead, we answer God's call in ALL that we do, in every action we take and every word we speak. And we don't do it for ourselves but for others. We help those that are most vulnerable without asking for anything for ourselves. *"Taking a child, he placed it in their midst, and putting his arms around it, he said to them, 'Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."* No glory, no hype. At least not in this life.

Humble servanthood leads to salvation. And THAT is the goal we all seek.
