

Jesus responds by indicating that the Pharisees nullify God's law with their traditions and He cites among them the violation of the commandment to honor one's parents, but the Pharisees allow for declaring goods dedicated to God and unavailable to assist one's parents.

Today's passage unfortunately leaves out a number of verses that would have enhanced our understanding of Jesus' teaching and its effect. One of those flows from Jesus instructing that it is not what enters a man that makes him impure but rather what comes out of him. Mark then gives the editorial comment that "Thus did he render all foods clean" (v.19). That makes it possible for us to enjoy ham, shrimp, shellfish, prosciutto and Italian sausage!

It is also worth noting that the Pharisees would be notably active surrounding Jesus' arrest and trial.

NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

This weekend we celebrate the **22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time**, and the readings tell of the importance of living in God's love through our actions.

In the first reading from the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses says to his people, "...hear the statutes and decrees which I am teaching you to observe, that you may live ...Observe [the commandments] carefully, for thus will you give evidence of your wisdom and intelligence to the nations." Those Ten Commandments still guide us today. They serve as a guide to live by as Christians and hold us accountable in our actions.

The second reading from St. James also reminds us that living with perseverance in our faith is essential as Christians. While the commandments instruct us on how we should live for God (and one another). He begins his letter with a beautiful greeting, *"Dearest brothers and sisters: All good giving and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of Lights."* Isn't that a beautiful description? – *The "Father of Lights"*. WE are the lights that are sent out to share God's message to all, *"Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls. Be <u>doers</u> of the word and not hearers only."* We are called to be active in our faith, and not hold our belief so close to our chest that we keep it to ourselves. No. We must share that faith with EVE-RYONE we encounter, and in every action we make.

Our gospel passages are now back to St. Mark after hearing St. John's Bread of Life Discourse. Fr. Laird describes the passage thoroughly in his bulletin letter, so I will just offer that this reading urges us to live for God in both word and deed.

Jesus pointedly shares Isaiah's words, *"This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me"* and Jesus goes on to say, *"You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition."* Let's face it, we all know right from wrong. We know we are called to live for, and lead others to, Jesus. Is it difficult to do? I don't really think so. I know I have a simplistic view of this, but I say – JUST BE KIND. Remember that Golden Rule? Even if we don't agree, treat others the way you want to be treated. No, it's not always easy. We must ask for God's grace to assist us because unkind, mean-spirited words can wound hearts – sometimes beyond repair. So, we must be vigilant in the practice of sharing our faith in all we do. Smile. Use caring and gentle words and gestures. If we all could just strive to live in this way – just think how much better our world could be.
