

### The Word of the Laird



Today's first reading is the second of two instances where David spares Saul's life (I Samuel 24, 26). The first was a situation where David and his men were hiding in a cave and Saul goes into the cave to "relieve" himself. David takes the occasion to cut a piece off of Saul's mantle. David later shows it to Saul as evidence that he is not out to attack Saul. So similarly in today's reading David goes into Saul's camp during the night when everyone is sleeping and takes Saul's spear and water jug. The next day he displays the spear and returns it as evidence that he would not harm the Lord's anointed.

Our reading from Luke today is a parallel to part of Matthew's Sermon on the Mount. Jesus encourages His followers to adhere to the example of God who does good for all, the just and the unjust. He exhorts them to love their enemies, to do good to those who harm them. The encouragement Jesus gives reflects the goodness of God toward all. And we are called to reflect that goodness in our lives as well.

As Paul continues his letter to the Corinthians, he now addresses the issue of the natural versus the spiritual. And for Paul, the real goal is the spiritual in which he sees Jesus as the first and foremost example.

#### A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

This week we celebrate the **7**<sup>th</sup> **Sunday of Ordinary Time**, and our readings entrust to us God's loving and compassionate mercy.

Our first reading from the Book of Samuel relates to us the story of King Saul searching for David. Saul was convinced that David was out to get him, and he became obsessed with finding him; so much so that he put together an army of 3000 men to go after him. How did David respond to this? With mercy. He finds Saul asleep and vulnerable, but David insists that he not be harmed because he was anointed by God. FYI: "Following Saul's death, David was appointed king of Judah for seven years before becoming king of all Israel. In total, David would rule for 40 years as king, serving as the Lord's anointed. He had treated the previous king with great respect and later received the role himself, being called a man after God's own heart" (1 Sam 13:13-14).

Mercy is also expressed in the responsorial psalm. "Bless the LORD, O my soul; and all my being, bless his holy name...

Merciful and gracious is the LORD, slow to anger and abounding in kindness."

This week's second reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians tells us "The first man (Adam) was 'earthly'; the second man (Christ) was from heaven. As Christians, we spend our life aspiring to live as disciples of Christ, yet we are "earthly" people, like Adam before us. This is not just imagery, but rather a recognition that we, though "earthly" people, will one day "bear the image of the heavenly one." This hope assures us that through God's mercy and our dedication – we too, can one day live in God's glory.

This week's gospel passage from St. Luke pointedly directs us to be merciful to others, just as God shows mercy to us. Recently, we had a lesson in youth group on mercy, and I reiterated the importance of loving others — even when we don't agree with them; even if they think differently than "we" do or live in a way "we" don't find acceptable. It isn't up to us to judge — God is (or certainly should be) our only judge. "Love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." Those are words everyone should take to heart. That right there sums up our Christian call to show and share God's love and mercy with all. We are given opportunities every single day to reflect God's love to everyone we encounter. I pray that with the help of God, we can all strive to show mercy to others, just as our God shows mercy to us. "For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."


