

Today we celebrate "Holy Family Sunday." The Gospel for this cycle of readings (Cycle C) is the story about Jesus remaining in Jerusalem after the feast of Passover and that Mary and Joseph had to travel back to Jerusalem and search for him. This was an ordeal of three days (similar to the "three days in the tomb"). In the understanding of that time even a part of a day was considered as one day. So following Jesus' crucifixion He was buried before sunset on Friday, He was in the tomb all of Saturday and He rose from the tomb sometime after sunset on Saturday.

You may recall that a year or two ago I mentioned having read the book "Three Days: The Search for the Boy Messiah" by Chris Stepien. I found it to be a delightful read. It not only considered the three days of the missing Christ child but it also explored the feelings and emotions of both Mary and Joseph in the situation in which they found themselves. Mary was engaged to Joseph and she is found to be pregnant. Joseph decides to divorce her quietly when an angel tells him the child was conceived not by another man but by the Holy Spirit.

The devotion that Mary and Joseph, the trust that they developed in each other, must have been phenomenal. It was against that background that Jesus was born and raised to be the person that He was and is.

A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

MERRY CHRISTMAS! Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph! Now that we have entered into the beautiful season of Christmas, today's opening Antiphon relates, *"The shepherds went in haste, and found Mary and Joseph and the Infant lying in a manger."* And the opening prayer (the Collect) at Mass reminds us that God in his great goodness, gave us the *"shining example of the Holy Family."* All of us are called to holiness, making ALL our families holy. The model of THE Holy Family is one we can and should emulate, but all families are not created equal. Some only have one parent, some have extra parents (step-parents). Some children are raised by grandparents, and some have two moms or two dads. Last week our gospel passage told the story of Mary visiting her cousin, Elizabeth. These two women, cousins and believers, were also part of a holy family. The community of Sts. Mary and Matthew are a holy family—so this week's celebration is for us all, with Jesus, Mary and Joseph as our guides.

The second reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians tells us how to best live as a family of true faith. *"Brothers and sisters: Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and pa-tience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do."* (Col 3: 12-13) What a paradigm of holiness for us to aspire to.

Our gospel passage from St. Luke, delves into what it's like to be a parent in a holy family, while worrying about your child. I'm here to tell you, even when your children are adults you still worry, which is natural because worry and love go hand in hand. Here we have the story of 12-year-old Jesus being left behind in Jerusalem (for three days) after having celebrated Passover. When his parents finally find him, Mary laments, **"Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety."** And can't you just imagine Jesus, calmly replying, **"Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?"** These holy parents probably wanted to throw up their hands in frustration—yet we are told that even though they didn't understand, **"his mother kept all these things in her heart."**

As Christian families we strive for holiness. If we were blessed with parental examples that showed us how to love, we should thank God and count ourselves grateful. If we were not that fortunate then we must look to the Holy Family as our example. To live as holy families we must lovingly and unconditionally accept one another for who God made us to be. We must strive to keep those we love close to our hearts. We in our individual families, and within our church family, must live together in love. For me, that's what it truly means to be holy.
