The Word of the Laird



Today's Gospel reading from Mark is the midpoint of his Gospel. Jesus inquires about who people are saying He is. Then, after a variety of possibilities, He asks who the disciples say He is. Peter responds that He is the Christ, the Messiah. Then Jesus offers the first prediction of His passion. Once again, it is Peter who speaks, remonstrating with Him. But Jesus rejects this intervention referring to Peter as a tempter (Satan) who is judging not by God's standards but by man's.

There will be two more predictions of the passion in Chapters 9 and 10, each of them including His rising after three days. We need to remember also that the Jewish day began at sunset. So, on Good Friday, the time from when Jesus dies on the cross until sunset is one day; sunset Friday to sunset Saturday is the second day; and sunset Saturday until He rises from the tomb is the third day.

There are further healings and teachings in these chapters and also the marvelous transfiguration with Jesus talking with Moses and Elijah in the presence of Peter, James and John, the three whom Jesus will also have accompany Him closely during the agony in the garden.

One other element in Mark's Gospel that is notable is the repeated exhortation to silence and not telling about things. This may be a device that Mark uses to assist in understanding why more people did not adhere to faith in Jesus during His public ministry.

We may in our turn offer thanks for the gift of faith we have received.

A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

This weekend we celebrate the **24th Sunday in Ordinary Time**, and the readings again reflect the importance of living for God through word and deed.

In the first reading the Prophet Isaiah laments and proclaims that he lives for God in all he does, even when he is mistreated. "I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting." And he goes on to say, "The Lord GOD is my help, therefore I am not disgraced."

Likewise, the second reading from St. James gives us a guide as to how we should live in and share our faith. "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? … faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead." So, what is being asked of us as Christians? We are to serve others and do so with both joy and humility – because living like Christ is not only what we are called to do – but it's a beautiful way to live.

Our gospel passage from St. Mark finds Jesus asking his disciples, "Who do people say that I am? ... who do you say that I am?" Has anyone ever put that question to you? Who is Jesus to you? Is he your savior, your rock, your comfort, your best friend? Is he your God? Yes! We proclaim Jesus in ALL that we do – or at least we should. It's not always easy to do, especially in the world we live in today, but we must try. Jesus gives us unconditional mercy and love. We should exemplify that in the way we live our lives. We, like Peter, should proudly say, "You are the Christ!"

I was off last week enjoying some time with family. My sister, her husband and my niece visited from Oregon. I haven't seen them since 2018, so to say I was excited to hug them and spend precious time with them was an understatement. I am one of four sisters, and I'm the only one that still attends mass weekly. Two of my sisters are very spiritual and they consider themselves Catholic. One sister does not, and we disagree on many points – yet the love I have for all my sisters supersedes the differences. During this last visit, as we all gathered, I found myself speaking my truth more openly. My faith is central to who I am – it helps to define me and yet I've struggled with sharing that—even within my own family. I'm thinking many of you can relate to this, so here's the thing – I believe that the more we live our faith, in all that we do, the easier it becomes to share it. The more we pray for guidance and strength, the stronger we become as messengers of Christ. We need to pray for our family, friends, and everyone who needs the comfort, mercy and love of God but doesn't seem to know it (or chooses not to). We must pray for ourselves, as Christians, to live in a way that enables others to see Christ in us in the hopes of leading them to a life of faith. That's a big challenge, and it's not easy but it's so worth it! "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."

Dear Pastor:

We want to alert you and the members of your church of the threat to Catholic values within the proposed Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) to our New York State Constitution. The ERA is officially set to appear on the ballot for a popular vote on November 5, 2024, as Proposal One.

This state constitutional amendment, *among other things*, provides minor children with the fundamental right to abortion, chemical and later-term, as well as the fundamental right to engage in transgender medical interventions. The ERA empowers Courts to either uphold laws that ignore parental notice or consent or invalidate laws that require parental notice or consent for both of these life-ending or life-altering procedures. *The ERA potentially erodes protections for churches and other religious institutions to teach beliefs that run contrary to these newly created fundamental rights.*

The so-called ERA reads as though it simply promotes 'freedom and justice for all,' but it potentially harms children, families, and religious institutions; its impacts are far reaching. NY statutes already protect against the horrors of discrimination as does our current NYS Constitution. The ERA goes further, by not only eroding parental authority and crystallizing 'rights' for children that could be dangerous for them, but by threatening the ability of churches and other religious institutions to promote principles misaligned with radical reproductive and gender ideology.

The Coalition to Protect Kids-NY is a ballot issue committee missioned to defeat passage of the ERA. The Coalition is registered with the NYS Board of Elections, where any expenses paid to promote the defeat of this ballot measure must be reported. We have materials— Paid for by the Coalition to Protect Kids-NY— that we hope you will share, at your discretion and at no cost. Polls show that when people understand the effects of the ERA support for the amendment plummets.

The New York State Catholic Conference and the Diocese of Rochester oppose the ERA, and support the Coalition's mission to defeat it. Here are two ways we pray you will help us defeat the ERA:

- Post and share the Coalition's materials, (without any monetary expenditure) on your parish's website, social media, and on-line bulletins or newsletters.
- Make available and/or distribute (without any monetary expenditure) Coalition materials at your parish.
